# Effective EHR-Based Prompts

Providers should all agree & support adding prompts to EHR

Identify optimal timing to be useful in current workflow

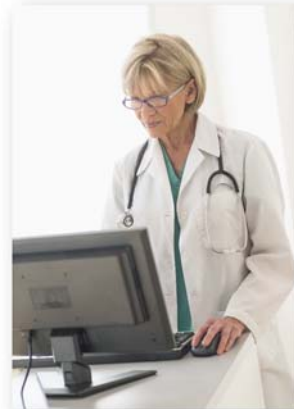
- Nurse/MA during intake and/or provider during encounter

Ensure everyone is aware of the prompt and agrees with the location on screen

- Greater success when prompt is at the top of the screen versus the bottom

To avoid prompt fatigue:

- Easy and actionable (1 line only)
- Reliable and consistent
- Provide accurate content

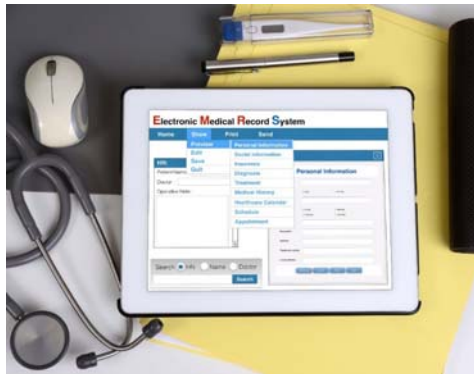

# Creating Electronic Prompts

Explore your EHR's options for location and text

Test options for location and text through PDSA cycles to identify optimal configuration for your practice



VHealth can provide free technical assistance for adolescent vaccine prompts

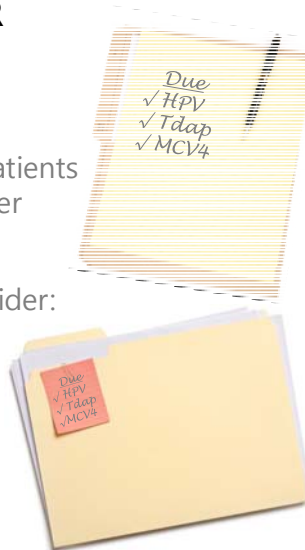

# Manual Provider Prompts

Manual prompts can also be effective without an EHR or in addition to EHR

## Build prompts into workflow and appointment preparation

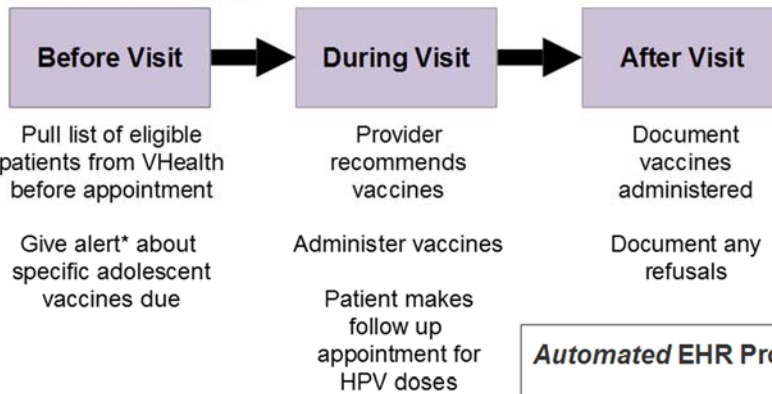
- Designated staff pulls list of scheduled patients from VHealth and verifies if HPV and other adolescent vaccines are due
- Use one or more options to flag for provider:
  - ✓ Sticker or sticky note
  - ✓ Preprinted vaccine form
  - ✓ Checklist of preventive services
  - ✓ Door flag



# Customize Your Workflow

Use prompts to remind providers to offer all vaccines due in a visit

## Sample Workflow: Manual Provider Prompts



\*Door flags, post-it note on chart, separate form, etc.
